Massive thanks to those parents that came along every week to support the teams, and helped manage, umpire and score games. Without you, this would literally not be possible, so thank you for your support and for turning up Friday nights and Saturday mornings to help.

Thanks to Canterbury Community Trust, we received a generous contribution to our Community coaching program, this allowed our coaches to reach more kids, and have more coaching hours at the club.

With the Cricket World Cup in town, we were given the opportunity to walk out the players for the opening game. What a massive day for 10 of our juniors!

They along with 20 other juniors from around Christchurch walked out Sri Lanka and New Zealand, Bella, Marcellus, Max, Vienna, Hayden, Connor, Cooper, Callum, Jimmy and Antonie had a great time at the game, and I was lucky enough to be working at the game to be able to see them walking out, a few tears were shed!

Over the winter 8 of our players have been playing Indoor cricket at Action Central, it's been great keeping these kids together, and again having not played any Indoor cricket before, they're coming together as a team and playing some great cricket.

I hope to see all the kids back this year, and hope to enter at least four teams on Saturdays. I look forward to watching these kids develop further.

# Senior A Report

Hello and welcome to the senior team report for the 2014/15 season, this season was always going to be tough, for a young and inexperienced senior team with only 5 members of last year's squad of 13 returning to play this season.

If you judged our season on our results, you would have to say it was a disappointing one, but I have to say that it was more to do with inconsistency than ability and injuries did not help our performance. The lack of commitment attending trainings was the telling point in our season. We were always competitive for 80% of our games which just isn't good enough in senior cricket.

The commitment showed on field each Saturday for the most part was very pleasing to be part of and a credit has to be paid to every player that turned up to play as we used 22 players over our 3 formats this season.

Looking to the more positive points of our season; firstly to James Knight the club needs to take its hat off to you for bringing up your 6500th senior run this season as well as your 500th senior wicket. James is closing in on taking the record for the most wickets for the club overall from Mark White, as well as the most Senior wickets overall so I do hope you will come back to claim top spot. Fraser Hawes is nipping on his tail picking up his 300th senior wicket this season. Well done lads.

James was also our top runs scorer this season with 469 runs and top wicket taker with 44 wickets over the season. With a team full of all-rounders it's hard to fit everyone in to their desired roles but one thing it does do, is put pressure on to perform and that helped us in the bowling department with some fantastic spells of bowling from everyone involved from Julian Ostle early season spells or Brendan Riach going for not much more than 2 runs per over or the spin twins who came to the fore front of a very competitive Twenty20 Campaign with Fraser Hawes picking up valuable wickets or to Jared Exeter's 5 wicket bag including a hat trick.

On to our batting for the season; something that we didn't do this season was put a price on our wickets, we gave far too many cheap wickets away at the worst times and it was usually 3-4 wickets falling for not many runs.

There were some bright points on our score cards Julian Ostles 79 against Addington was something to behold with some nice clean ball striking. The biggest highlight of the season batting wise would have to be the batting performance against New Brighton in a T20 game where Simon Billingsley and Arv Jassal shared a 150 run partnership with Simon scoring 83 and Arv 61.

Other notable mentions of our season would have to go out to Cameron Spriggs and Thomas Eggeleston, often thrown in the deep end but also performed their task asked of them with a great attitude which was all we could ask.

Lastly I'd like to thank Jake Richardson coming all the way from England for a second spell with the club with a plan to come over for a full season in 2016/17 season and to Carl Hooper our youngest player at only 17 years old who sometimes outshone us older veterans of the team with some amazing, quick bowling and some very sensible batting we would like to wish him all the best in the future and will always welcome him back should he wish to come play for Southern again.
